Trainer Pool: Trainers are available across the state capable of training birth to five.

Coaching: A new Early Childhood Coach training has been developed and is being used to develop a cadre of coaches.

Demonstration sites: Four demonstration sites. Include child care, early childhood program in a school district, Head Start.

Mental Health consultation: Kid Squad goes into child care at their request and provides consultation based on the strategies of the Teaching Pyramid.

School districts: A limited number of school district early childhood programs are involved in training and coaching.

Self Assessment: A Nebraska developed three part assessment is used by programs to assist with ensuring that certain elements are in place prior to implementing the strategies of the Teaching Pyramid.

Results Matter: Nebraska's child and family outcomes system is linked to the Teaching Pyramid.

College work: A Nebraska Community College has developed a course around the CSEFEL material, this will be shared with the state community college system.

Additional support: through the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act ten additional sites received training and are receiving mental health consultation follow up.
